Purpose of Education





Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan

Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan, the parent body of Bhavan's College, is a voluntary, ever-growing, apolitical national movement with an international outlook, devoted to life, literature and culture. Kulapati Dr. K. M. Munshiji founded the Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan in 1938, almost a decade before India's independence. Today it is fondly referred to simply as "The Bhavan" and has under its umbrella 320 constituent institutions with 112 centers in India and 7 centers overseas. Shri Munshiji was a multifaceted personality with a brilliant career and his firm belief in Indian culture and values has been the guiding force of the Bhavan's success and that of the many establishments founded by him.





Bhavan's College situated in the heart of Mumbai is one of the Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan's first institutions of higher education founded on Kulapati Dr. K. M. Munshiji firm belief in Indian culture and values. The foundation stone of the College was laid by former President of Independent India Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan and the College was inaugurated by Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, the Iron Man of India in 1946. The College though Autonomous is affiliated to the University of Mumbai and is eligible for Academic and Research grants from University Grants Commission due to its 2 (f) & 12(B) Status. Bhavan's College is one of the very few colleges which have the privilege to have completed 75 years of dedicated service in the field of education and celebrated its Diamond Jubilee in the very first decade of the new millennium.

The College is located at a walkable distance from the railway station at Andheri (W) and the Azad Nagar Metro Station and approachable by road and a number of bus routes. The College situated within 42 acres of vast green scenic campus has a well-equipped library, computer and scientific laboratories, huge play- ground, Gymkhana, Gymnasium, and facilities for NCC and NSS for girls and boys.

With grants from UGC, the College has established a UGC - NRC (UGC-Network Resource Centre) which provides internet access to students for academic purpose. The College has a host of qualified, experienced and dedicated teachers to guide the students at the undergraduate as well as post graduate level. The College has a strong faculty of eminent and versatile teachers with over 50% possessing a Doctorate Degree and about 10% involved in offering consultancy services.

However, the main strength of the College is the large number of students that enrolls such that since the last few years, the College is registering per year about 4000 students

The college prides itself on building effective relationships with all its stakeholders, especially in the corporate world. Strong academia-industry linkages have manifested into efficient student placements and faculty support.







Academic vocabulary at a glance

- 1. **Program:** A Program is a set of courses that are linked together in an academically meaningful way and generally ends with the award of a Degree Certificate depending on the level ofknowledge attained and the total duration of the study. A set of courses leading to award of degree like B.A; B.Sc; B.Com; M.Sc
- **2. Course:** A 'course' is essentially a constituent of a 'program' and may be conceived of as a composite of several learning topics taken from a certain knowledge domain, at a certain level. All the learning topics included in a course must necessarily have academic coherence, i.e. there must be a common thread linking the various components of a course. Course in simple terms refers to the earlier concept of "Subject" e.g. a course in History, a course in Rural Marketing, course in Chemistry.

3. Bridge Course

Bridge course is visualized as Pre semester preparation by thelearner before the commencement of regular lectures. For each semester the topics, whose knowledge is considered essential for effective and seamless learning of topics of the Semester, will be specified. The Bridge Course can be conducted in onlinemode. Online content can be created for the Bridge Course Topics.

4. Module and Unit

A course that is generally an independent entity having its ownseparate identity is also often referred to as a 'Module' in today's parlance, especially when we refer to a 'modular curricular structure'. A module may be studied in conjunction with other learning modules or studied independently. A topic within a course is treated as a Unit.

5. Self-Learning

Certain topics will be marked for Self-Learning.

Topicsfor Self-Learning are to be learned independently by the student, in a time-bound manner, using online and offline resources including online lectures, videos, library, discussions field work, internships etc. The purpose of evaluative sessions is to assess the level of the students' learning achieved in the topics earmarked for Self-Learning.

The teacher's role in these evaluative sessions will be that of a Moderator and Mentor, who will guide and navigate the discussions in the sessions, and offer concluding remarks, with proper reasoning on the aspects which may have been missed by the students, in the course of the Self-Learning process.

6. Credit Point

Credit Point refers to the 'Workload' of a learner and is an index of the number of learning hours deemed for a certain segment of learning. These learning hours may include a variety of learning activities like reading, reflecting, discussing, attending lectures/counselling sessions, watching especially prepared videos, writing assignments, preparing for examinations, etc. Credits assigned for a single course always pay attention to how may hours it would take for a learner to complete a single course successfully.

7. Credit Completion and Credit Accumulation

Credit completion or Credit acquisition shall be considered totake place after the learner has successfully cleared all the evaluation criteria concerning a single course. Learner's level of performance above the minimum prescribed level (viz. grades/marks obtained) has no bearing on the number of credits collected or acquired. A learner keeps on adding more and more credits as he completes successfully more and more courses. Thus, the learner 'accumulates' course-wise credits.

Note: The Ordinances and Regulations given below apply to Under Graduate Programs of the University.

- 1. The minimum duration of the Under GraduateProgram will be of 3 years in the Semester pattern i.e. from Sem. I to Sem. VI.
- 2. The degree will be awarded to a learner who completes 132 credits of the program in a period of 3 to 6 years from the year of enrolment to semester VI.
- 3. Types of courses included in a degree program are:
 - Compulsory discipline specific core courses as Major and Minor
 - ♦ Ability Enhancement course (AEC)
 - ♦ Discipline Specific elective (DSE)

- ♦ Value enhancement Course (VEC)
- ♦ Vocational/Skill enhancement course (VSEC)
- ♦ Generic/Open Elective (OE)
- ♦ Indian knowledge system (IKS)
- Field Projects/Research projects/Community Engagement Program (FP/RP/CEP)
- ◆ Co- Curricular Activities (CC)

8. Scheme of teaching and examination

The Scheme of Teaching and Examination shall be divided into TWO components, Internal assessment and External assessment (Semester-end examination) for each course of the program.

The performance of the learners shall be evaluated in

- Internal Assessment with 40% marks by way of continuous evaluation
- Semester End Examination with 60% marks by conducting the theory examination.

Internal Assessment

It is defined as the assessment of the learners based on continuous evaluation as envisaged in the credit-based system by way of participation of learners in various academic and correlated activities in the given semester of the program.

Semester end examination

It is defined as the examination of the learners based on performance in the semester-end theory / written examinations.

Semester End Examination-

60 Marks

Duration – These examinations shall be of 2 hours duration.

Passing standard and performance grading:

Passing standard

The learners to pass a course shall have to obtain a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate for each course where the course consists of Internal Assessment & Semester End Examination. The learners shall obtain a minimum of 40% marks (i.e. 16 out of 40) in the Internal Assessment and 40% marks in Semester End Examination (i.e. 24 Out of 60) separately, to pass the course and a minimum of Grade D in each project, wherever applicable, to pass a particular semester.

Performance Grading

The PERFORMANCE GRADING of the learners shall be on the TEN-point ranking system

The performance grading shall be based on the aggregate performance of the Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination.

CARRY FORWARD OF MARKS IN CASE OF A LEARNERWHO FAILS IN THE INTERNAL ASSESSMENT AND/ORSEMESTER-END ASSESSMENT IN ONE OR MORE SUBJECTS:

- 1. A learner who PASSES in the Internal Examination but FAILS in the Semester End Examination of the courseshall reappear for the Semester End Examination of that course. However, his/her marks of the Internal Examinations shall be carried over and he/she shall be entitled to the grade obtained by him/her on passing.
- 2. A learner who PASSES in the Semester End Examination but FAILS in the Internal Assessment of the course shall reappear for the Internal Examination that course. However, his/her marks of the Semester End Examination shall not be carried over
 - In the case of a learner who is reappearing for the Internal Examination, the examination will consist of one project of 40 marks which will be divided into 20 marks for the documentation of the project, 10 marks for the presentation, and 10 marks for the viva and theinteraction
- 3. Assessment Under NEP will be as follows
 - All the courses with:
 - 3 / 4 credits will be of 100 marks for theory while 1 / 2 credits will be of 50 marks for practical / theory as applicable
 - Each theory paper of 100 marks will be evaluated on 60:40 pattern. External Semester End (ESE) will be 60 marks and Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) will be 40 marks.
 - The evaluation of Practical wherever applicable will be done once at the end of each semester.
 - Criteria of passing: A learner must get minimum 40% of the maximum marks in CIA, ESE and Practical. In another words a learner will have to pass in each and every component (CIA, ESE and Practical)
 - In CIA a learner must get minimum 16 marks out of 40 marks.
 - In ESE a learner must get minimum 24 marks out of 60 marks or 20 marks out of 50 marks.
 - In Practical a learner must get minimum 20 marks out of 50 marks or minimum 16 marks out of 40 marks as applicable.
 - A learner not obtaining the minimum marks as specified above will be declared fail in that component.
 - In case of failure in any of the component/s head a learner will have to re-appear in that component/s in which he has failed.
 - A learner shall be awarded the allotted credits for the given course provided he/she passes in all its components and as and when a learner acquires the prescribed total credits in a semester, he/she shall be declared successful for the respective semesters

ATKT rules are read as follows

- A learner is Allowed to Keep Terms (ATKT) for even semester of the same academic year irrespective of their number of courses in which he/she is failing in odd semester of that academic year.
- o A learner is Allowed to Keep Terms (ATKT) for semester 3 provided

- he / she gets minimum 14 credits out of 22 credits in each of the semester 1 and semester 2 A learner is Allowed to Keep Terms (ATKT) for semester 5 provided
- he / she gets all 22 credits in each of the semesters 1,2,3 and 4

OR

• he / she gets minimum 14 credits out of 22 credits in each of the semester 1 & semester 2 and gets all 22 credits in each of the semesters 3 and 4

OR

- he / she gets minimum 14 credits out of 22 credits in each of the semester 3 & semester 4 and gets all 22 credits in each of the semesters 1 and 2
- A learner who does not appear i.e. remains absent in some or allthe courses on medical grounds or for representing
 the college/university in sports, cultural activities, activities of NSS, NCC, or sports training camps conducted by
 recognizedbodies / competent authorities or for any other reason which is considered valid under exceptional
 circumstances and to the satisfaction of the Principal or the Head of the Institute is eligible to appear for the additional
 examination.
- A learner who does not appear for both the Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination shall not be eligible to appear for the additional Semester End Examination.
- It is not the right of the leaner, who has remained absent, to appear for the additional examination without fulfilling the norms prescribed by the Head of the Institution/ Department/Principal of the College.

Attendance

Attendance at lectures and tutorials is mandatory.

Attendance of students at all courses is regulated by the Policy created Bhavan's autonomous College "For granting terms, attendance of 50% of theory, practical and tutorials (wherever prescribed) separately will be required, out of the total number of lectures, practical and tutorials conducted in the term."

The college will grant terms only on the basis of:

- (a) Satisfactory attendance
- (b) Satisfactory performance in classroom tests and at the Terminal and Preliminary examinations.
- (c) Satisfactory completion of the course of study for the term/year for the class towhich such a student belongs.
- (d) Good conduct.

Students who do not satisfy these conditions will not be granted terms. This means that such students will not be eligible to take the Examinations.

The principal is empowered to excuse absence of students who are required to leave the town where the College is situated for the purpose of taking part in sports held under the auspices of the University or government body for the period during which they are unavoidably absent from the College.

Dress Code

At Bhavans, we believe in inculcating a sense of discipline. Thus, the college observes a dress code based on decency. A student failing to adhere to the dress code will face disciplinary action.

Documents issued by the College

Identity card

The Identity Card is an important document. Every student is required to take a good care of it and must always carry it with oneself. Students are required to show it on demand in the College, in the library, at any collageevent and while travelling on local trains. The loss of Identity Card should be immediately reported to the College Office in writing, with a statement of the circumstances in which it was lost. The office will issue a Duplicate Identity Card against payment of Rs.100/-.

At the Examination all candidates are required to produce, at the examination centers, their identity cards bearing their photographs attested by the principal along with their Hall Tickets.

Railway concession

All students are eligible for concession on railways for local journeysbetween the stations nearest to the place of their residence in Mumbai and the College; Students are requested to enter their local and permanent addresses correctly in the Admission Formsto facilitate issue of such Railway concession orders.

The place of permanent residence, in the application for admission means the place where the student and/or his parents normally reside. This address will not be allowed to be changed during the academic year.

The counter is open MONDAY to FRIDAY 10:15am to 12:00pm.

Transcripts

Students desirous of pursing further studies abroad should apply for transcripts online through link mentioned on the website of the college. If astudent needs hard copies, then can come and apply for the same in collegeafter receiving online transcripts. They need to pay the necessary fees to accounts department. This procedure takes a week's time.

For letter of recommendation, the student needs to make the draft get it approved by the concerned teacher and pay the necessary fees to accountsdepartment then submit the draft at transcripts counter. The draft is sent to the editor for editing and then printed on the letter head of the college. This procedure takes a week time.

Days and timings are Monday to Friday, 10.00am to 1.00 pm.

Duplicate copies of documents

Students who intend to apply for duplicate copies of their statements of marks, certificates of passing, degree certificates as well as special certificates, should produce an affidavit on a non-judicial stamp paper of Rs.100/- made in that behalf before the metropolitan magistrate or notary appointed by the government to that effect, the reason for the issue of duplicate copy of the aforesaid documents mentioning therein so also, thefirst information report FIR registered in the police station for the reasonswhatsoever, i.e., loss, damage of the same, etc, to check the misuse of the aforesaid documents. On completion of these formalities and payment of necessary fees the required duplicate certificates will be issued to the concerned students accordingly.

Code of Conduct

- Students joining the college are strictly bound by the Rules and Regulations of the college.
- Every student must obtain on admission, and keep his/her Identity Card affixed with photograph, duly attested and present it for inspection on demand.
- Students must attend lectures and tutorials according to the
 timetable on all working days of the College. Students
 should not be absent from lectures, tutorials and
 examinations without prior permission of the principal.
 Students are warned that if their attendance at lectures
 and tutorials is unsatisfactory, their names may be
 struck off the college rolls/or may be detained from the
 examinations.
- In case of illness, a student must apply for leave, as soon as possible, with a doctor's certificate. He /She must personally report to the Prof. In charge / Vice Principal on resuming class.
- Students must not attend classes other than their own without the permission of the principal.
- Smoking is strictly prohibited in the College premises.
- Students shall do nothing either inside or outside the College that will in any way interfere with its orderly conduct and discipline.
- No Society or Association can be formed in the College and no person invited to address a meeting without the principal's prior permission and sanction.
- No student shall collect any money or contribution for picnic, trip, educational visit to some place, get-together, study-notes, charity or any other activity without prior sanction of the principal.
- No student will be allowed to take active part in current politics.
- No student shall communicate any information or write about matters dealing with the College in any manner to the Press or Media.
- Students are expected to take proper care of college property and to help in keeping the premises neat and clean. Causing damage to the property of the College, e.g. disfiguring walls, doors, fittings, or breaking furniture, etc., is a breach of discipline and the guilty will be duly punished.
- The College is not responsible for lost property. However, students may approach and inform the Vice Principal for the lost property to find out, if it is deposited in the College Office.

- Students applying for certificates, testimonials, etc. and those requiring the principal's signature on any kind of documents or applications should first contact the College office for verification. Students should bring no paper directly to the principal for his/her signature.
- If, for any reason, the continuance of a student in the College, is, in the opinion of the principal, detrimental to the best interest of the College, the Principal may ask such a student to leave the College without assigning any reason for his/her expulsion.
- Insubordination and unbecoming language or misconduct on the part of a student are sufficient reasons for his/her suspension or dismissal from the college.
- Students receiving Government or College Scholarships or any remission in fees, must note that the grant and continuance thereof are subject to good behavior, regular attendance and satisfactory progress and good results at College and Board or University Examinations.
- All College activities must be organized under the guidance and supervision of the Principal and Professor In-Charge with prior permission only.
- Students must not associate themselves with any activity not authorized by the College Principal. Serious view will be taken of students found organizing or participating in such unauthorized activities.
- Students using unfair means at examinations will not be readmitted to the College.
- It is the responsibility of the student to read the notice boards regularly for important announcements made by the College authorities from time to time. They will not be excused or be given any concession on grounds of ignorance.
- Use of cell phones is banned inside the college premises. Defaulters are liable to be punished.
- Students are prohibited to use college name to any private or individual event. Violation may lead to permanently debarring such students from the college.
- Matters not covered under the existing rules will rest at the absolute discretion of the principal.
- The College prohibits any conduct by any student or students which has effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other students or indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities. Ragging is totally prohibited in Institution & anyone found guilty or ragging and/or abetting ragging, whether actively passively is liable to be punished in accordance with the regulations.

What constitutes ragging?

The college has a zero-tolerance policy towards ragging. The college conforms with all the guidelines on Anti-Ragging issued from time to time. Bhavan's. College has a fully functional 'Anti Ragging Squad'.

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- 1. Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or anyother student.
- 2. Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to causeannoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or toraise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any otherstudent.
- 3. Asking any student to do any act which such student will notin the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causingor generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- 4. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts ordisturbs the regular academic activity of any other studentor a fresher.
- 5. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student forcompleting the academic tasks assigned to an individual or agroup of students.
- 6. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students
- 7. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexualabuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene andlewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other dangerto health or person;
- 8. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or anyother student.
- 9. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent toderive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.
- 10. Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher orotherwise) on the ground of color, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence oreconomic background.

Measures for prohibition of ragging

- The institutions shall take action in accordance with these Regulations against those found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging, actively or passively, or being part of a conspiracy to promote ragging.
- The application for admission, enrolment or registration must be accompanied by an Anti-Ragging affidavit signed by a student in a prescribed format and another Anti Ragging Affidavit signed by a Parent/Guardian. (Both these Affidavits can be downloaded from www.antiragging.in or www.amanmovement.org)

Administrative action in the event of raging

The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed here in under:

- a) Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- b) Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and otherbenefits.
- c) Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process.
- d) Withholding results.
- e) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- f) Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
- g) Cancellation of admission.

Investigation in case of Malpractice during Examinations

As per Ordinance 5050 of Mumbai University and adapted by the exam policy of autonomous Bhavan's college, the Principal of the constituent College shall be the competent authority to take appropriate disciplinary action against the student/s using, attempting to use, aiding, abetting, instigating, or allowing to use unfair means at the examination conducted by the College or Institution on behalf of the University based on the recommendation of UFMIC committee

Definition - Unless the context otherwise requires:

- (a) "Student" means and includes a person who is enrolled as such by the University/College/Institution/Department/ School for receiving instruction qualifying for any degree, diploma or certificate awarded by the University. It includes ex-student and student registered as candidate (examinee) for any of the degree, diploma or certificate examination.
- (b) "Unfair means" includes-one or more of the following acts or omissions on the part of student/s during the examination period.

- (i) Possessing unfair means material/ all forms of electronic gadgets and or copying therefrom.
- (ii) Transcribing any unauthorized material or any other use thereof.
- (iii) Intimidating or using obscene language or threatening or use of violence against invigilator or person on duty for the conduct of examination or manhandling him/her or leaving the examination hall. without permission of the supervisor or causing disturbances in any manner in the examination proceedings.
- (iv) Unauthorizedly communicating with other examinees or anyone else inside or outside the examination hall.
- (v) Mutual/Mass copying.
- (vi) Smuggling-out, either blank or written, or smuggling-in of answer books as copying material.
- (vii) Smuggling-in blank or written answer book and forging signature of the Jr. Supervisor thereon.

The Broad Categories of Unfair Means Resorted to by Students at the University/College/Institution Examinations and the Quantum of Punishment for each Category thereof:

Exclusion of the student from University or College or Institution examination for four additional examinations. (Note: - This money shall be credited to the Vice-Chancellor's Fund)

10. Using obscene language/violence threat at the examination center by a student at the University /College/Institution examination to Jr./Sr. Supervisor/ Chief Conductor or Examiners.

Exclusion of the student from University or College or Institution examination for four additional examinations.

11.a) Impersonation at the University/College/ Institution examination. Exclusion of the student from University or College or Institution examination for five additional examinations. (both the students if impersonator is University or College or Institute Student).

b) Impersonation by a University/College /Institute student at S.S.C/H.S.C. any other examinations.

Exclusion of the impersonator from University or College or Institution examination for five additional examinations.

12. Revealing identity in any form in the answer written or in any other part of the answer book by the student at the University or College or Institution examination.

Annulment of the performance of the Student at the University or College or Institution examination in full.

13. Found having written on palms or on the body or on the clothes while in the examination.

Annulment of the performance of the Student at the University or College or Institution examination in full.

14. All other malpractices not covered in the aforesaid categories.

Annulment of the performance of the student at the University or college or Institution examination in full, and severe punishment depending upon the gravity of the offence.

Admission Procedures

To Fill Registration form for FY Degree Courses

- Subject: The subject selection should be as per the availability of subject in the college.
 Make sure you select the subject/papers for which you are eligible and which is taught in the college.
- **DOB/Gender:** Make sure you select personal details such as gender/DOB/Medium of instruct ion/ Disability (if any) properly
- o **Name in Devnagari / Marathi:** The name in Devnagari script/ Marathi script should be as youdesire/write in all your testimonials in Devnagari script.

All admission through student Application and fee payment System is done through Mastersoft ERP, however, soft copy should be saved and printout of form must be submitted when college reopens. An incomplete application will not be considered for admission.

Student should regularly visit college website www.bhavans.ac.in for various circulars/notifications and to check the eligibility list which indicates if the candidate is allowed to be promoted to higher class based on various exam ordinances and regulations.

- Students are advised to verify the admission forms before submission to avoid any sort of mistakes Once the form is submitted by the students, the college will verify the student's information and approve their admission 'through a merit list displayed on the website after which only the students can make the payment of fee online.

Degree College Cancellation of admission & Refund of Fees (Subject to revision)

- Students are hereby informed that cancellation of admission followed by refund of fees will only be done if the following procedure is followed:
- Student must first give an application for cancellation through the Mastersoft Online ERP portal filling in all the details specified. A print out of the application will then be attached and submitted to the office for further processing along with their hand-written application
- The office admin staff will forward the same to the Vice principal in charge of the respective faculty who will append their comments after due discussions with HOD and send it to principal for final approval.
- The document after receiving approval from Principal will be forwarded to Accounts Office for initiation of refund. All amounts refunded must be logged in the Mastersoft portal and will be done through NEFT banking facilities. Amount refunded will be as per the University Ordinance 0.2859 relating to the refund

O.2859: Refund of Tuition, Development and all other fees after cancellation of admissions: The candidates who have taken admission in under graduate courses in Govt. colleges, in Govt. aided and unaided courses conducted by affiliated colleges, and recognized institutions may request for refund of fees after applying in writing for cancellation of their admission to the course. The percentage of fees for the course shall be refunded to the candidate after deducting charges as follows: -

- All the fees items chargeable for one year are as per relevant University circular for different Faculties (excluding the courses for which the total amount is fixed by other competent authorities).
- ◆ The fees charged towards group insurance and all fees paid as University share (including Vice-Chancellor's fund, University fees for sports and cultural activities, E-charge, disaster management fund, exam fees and Enrollment fees) are non- refundable if payment is made by the college prior to the date of cancellation.
- Fees collected for Identity card and Library card, admission form and prospectus, enrollment and any other course specific fees are not refundable after the commencement of the academic term.
- ♦ All refundable deposits (Laboratory, Caution Money and Library etc.) shall be fully returned at the time of cancellation.

Kindly Note

- Provided that wherever admissions are made through centralized admission process for pro-fessional and/or for any other courses by other competent Authorities, the Refund Rules are applicable if specified by such authorities (as per the rules of relevant agencies) for the 1st year admission.
- In case of admission to subsequent years of the course, O.2859 is applicable for cancellation of admission. Provided further that this refund rules is concurrent with the rules and guide-lines of other Professional statutory bodies appointed for admission to relevant courses.
